OBJECTIVE


This Portfolio aims to provide investors with long-term capital growth.

Investments to be included in the portfolio may, apart from assets in liquid form, consist of local and global equity securities, non-equity securities, convertible stock, preference shares and property securities as well as any other securities which are considered consistent with the Portfolio's primary objective and that the Act may allow from time to time. The Portfolio Manager will have the maximum flexibility to vary assets between the various markets, asset classes and countries to reflect the changing economic and market conditions. The Portfolio may also include participatory interests in portfolios of collective investment schemes and may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments.

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

CHARACTERISTICS

This is a multi-asset fully flexible portfolio which means that it may invest in a spectrum of equity, bond, property and money market and tends to have an increased probability of short term volatility and aims to maximise long term capital growth. The Portfolio may have a maximum equity exposure of up to 100% and is fully flexible as to whether to invest offshore or locally. This Portfolio may, at the discretion of the Portfolio Manager, invest up to 100% of the assets outside of South Africa.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- The annual fee referred to above is a maximum permissible fee and includes 1.15% payable to NFB Asset Management, 0.23% payable to Ci Collective Investments and 0.12% payable to Analytics Consulting.
- The Portfolio Manager may borrow up to 10% of the market value of the Portfolio to bridge insufficient liquidity.
- Manager shall reserve the right to close the Portfolio to new investors on a date determined by the Manager.
- In order to consolidate and aggregate NFB's activities one NFB portfolio may invest in another NFB portfolio. NFB will not earn additional fees as a result of such investments.

RISK / REWARD PROFILE

HIGH

Typically, the lower the risk the lower the potential return and the higher the risk the higher the potential return. RISKS
